






Hemp Cultivation Area in the EU (ha) 2017: ca. 42,500 ha






Results of the 2015 EIHA survey: Hemp Fibres




Yearly average prices of technical flax and hemp short fibres in €-cent/kg (supply of 100 tonnes per year to factory gate in Central Europe)








Results of the 2015 EIHA survey: Hemp Shivs





Results of the 2015 EIHA survey: Hemp Seeds







The Cologne Declaration on Industrial Hemp

The European Industrial Hemp Association (EIHA) Cologne (Germany), 7 June 2017

This Declaration has been signed by the following participants of the "14th International Conference of the European Industrial Hemp Association", 7 - 8 June 2017, Maternushaus, Cologne, Germany

Industrial hemp delivers a remarkable global performance and attracts more and more investments. Hemp is a multi-purpose crop, a biorefinery by nature, delivering fibres, shives, seeds and active plant ingredients for food supplements and pharmaceuticals at the same time.



1) Reasonable and harmonised legislation on THC guidance values for food

The signatories urge policy makers to develop a reasonable and harmonised legislation on THC guidance values for food in Europe and in all member states, to make sure that consumers are protected, to sustain the industry's current double-digit growth rate, to attract new investors, create jobs and to boost product development.

2) Reasonable and harmonised legislation on hemp extracts and non-psychotropic cannabinoids

The signatories urge policy makers to develop a reasonable and harmonised legislation on cannabinoids and hemp extracts as food supplement ingredients as well as pharmaceuticals (depending on the dose) in Europe and in all member states, to make sure that consumers are protected, to sustain the industry's current double-digit growth rate, to attract new investors, create jobs and to boost development of safe products.

3) Reasonable legislation on THC content in industrial hemp varieties

The signatories urge policy makers to create European legislation allowing for industrial hemp to possess a THC content below 0.3% in harmonisation with the rest of the world to create a level playing field especially with Canada and the USA.

4) End the ban of the cultivation of industrial hemp in the UN Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs

China Rediscovers Hemp

China Rediscovers Hemp

Hemp has attracted attention among China's scientific, political and industrial communities

China's Heilongjiang Province massively steps up its research and development efforts to make fine, environmentally friendly hemp fibres a large-scale alternative to cotton. Additionally, experts work on hemp foods and pharmaceuticals. Western companies are invited to participate in the hemp boom.



Although the cultural history of using hemp on an industrial scale can be traced back to China and the first ropes (2800 BC), papers and textiles (500 – 100 BC) ever made, hemp became sidelined a little over the past one hundred years. But that is a matter of the past now. In their search for alternatives to cotton, hemp has attracted attention among China's scientific, political and industrial communities. Cotton is increasingly causing environmental problems due to its enormous need for water, soil salinization and the use of pesticides. Neither the quality nor the price of Chinese cotton are very competitive. Last year, China

imported three million tons of cotton from the U.S., something that was unimaginable until very recently.

Given these developments, the Chinese province of Heilongjiang has decided to review the entire hemp production value chain and to produce hemp on a large industrial scale. Within only a few years, the area on which hemp is cultivated has grown from below 2,500 to more than 74,000 acres in Heilongjiang Province alone this year. This is a level of magnitude on par with the overall hemp cultivation area in Canada or Europe. If everything goes well, the area will total roughly 150,000 acres as early as next year.

In Harbin, the capital of Heilongjiang Province (located in Manchuria in the north-east of the People's Republic of China), the "2017 International Conference On Hemp Industry" (www.hempalliance.org) was held on 3 and 4 August 2017. With 300 delegates hailing from China itself as well as Australia, Europe and Canada, this was one of the largest conferences ever dedicated to hemp. The conference was supported by the local province government as well as the national Textile and Clothing Council. In their talks and the accompanying exhibition, scientists and industry representatives proudly presented their success stories to experts from all over the world.


